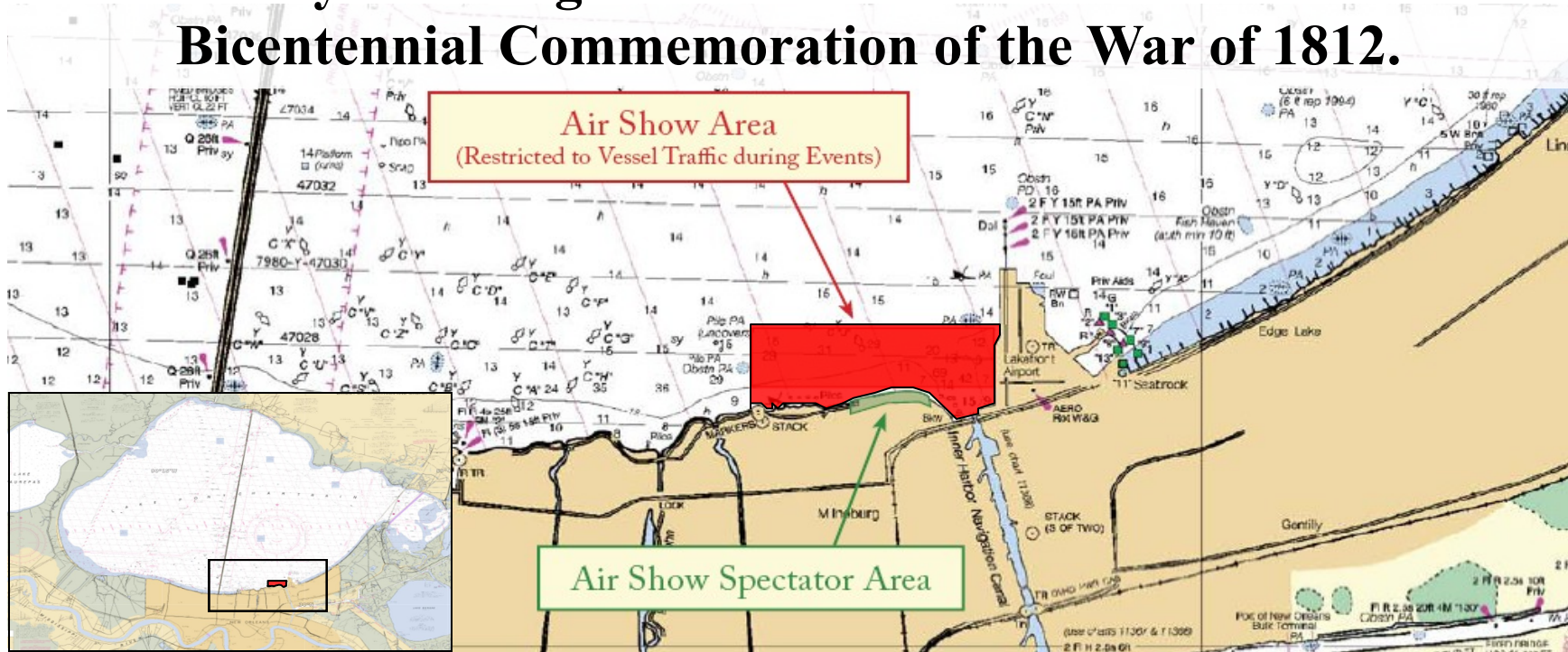


# US Navy Blue Angels Air Show in association with the Bicentennial Commemoration of the War of 1812.



The USCG Captain of the Port New Orleans, under the authority of the Ports and Waterways Safety Act, will establish a safety zone in the above location (red box). The box extends 12,000 feet east (2 Nautical Miles) from 090° 04' 10.05" West Longitude to the western side of Lakefront Air Port and will extend 3,000 feet south (.5 Nautical Miles) from 30° 02' 38.37" North Latitude to the southern shore. **Operators are reminded that no vessel is allowed to operate within the safety zone without approval from the USCG Captain of the Port New Orleans.** Seabrook Launch will be unavailable for public launches while the safety zone is in effect.

**Air Show times are as follows:**

- 19-20 APR 2012:** No Air Show (Safety Zone will be in effect from 1000-1700 EST)
- 21 APR 2012:** 1300-1600 EST (Safety Zone will be in effect from 1000-1700 EST)
- 22 APR 2012:** 1330-1600 EST (Safety Zone will be in effect from 1000-1700 EST)

New Orleans Blue Angels Air Show


The U.S. Coast Guard Captain of the Port New Orleans, under the authority of the Ports and Waterways Safety Act, will establish a safety zone on Lake Pontchartrain, extending approximately 3,000 feet out from the south shores adjacent to the east bank of the Lakefront Airport runways. This safety zone is needed to protect persons and vessels from the potential safety hazards associated with high speed aerobatic displays to be performed by the participants of the New Orleans Blue Angels Air Show. This rule is effective daily from April 19, 2012-April 22, 2012, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. local.

All vessels are prohibited from entering this safety zone unless they have been granted permission by the Captain of the Port New Orleans or designated representative. All vessels requesting permission to enter or transit through this safety zone are required to contact the Coast Guard small boat on scene via VHF-FM Channel 12 or VHF-FM Channel 16 in the event of an emergency.
